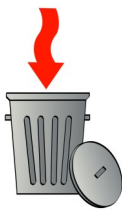

We would rather train and not be needed than be needed and not be trained. Like all of you, we too listened to the “experts” who earlier this year proclaimed this would be a 70% busier year than normal. So CERT recruited some new members and got them trained up to be ready to help if needed. With the season over, now is the time for those of you who might be thinking about joining CERT to do so. If you don’t want to make that kind of a commitment, we will be compiling a list of community residents and their resources to use in the event of an emergency. There will be sign-up sheets available at the MWFPOA meetings and we’ll have a link on the CERT tab at meadowwoodfarmsocala.com.

What resources might we be looking for? Do you have a chainsaw and would be willing to help clear a roadway or a tractor to move those branches so emergency vehicles can get through? Do you know a second language that might come in handy? Are you a nurse, do you have EMT training, a golf cart to help move injured if needed, an ATV and cart to move supplies as needed, can you help fill out forms or are you good at comforting folks? These are all things that can be a great help to MWF and you don’t have to go through the CERT training to help your neighbors. We know you would help anyway if a disaster strikes, but we would like to have an idea of what is available out there so there could be a coordinated effort and we can better serve all of MWF.

Roads Status Report 10/21/13

Jim Bain- MWFPOA Liaison with the County

While it doesn't look or feel like much is happening on our road project, there is a lot of work going on "behind the scenes." Surveyors have marked and measured our roads, engineers have examined their condition, and plans are being developed to be made available to qualified contractors. The plans should be ready by the middle of December and I've been invited to review them as they go out for bid. I'm looking forward to seeing exactly what the engineers have in mind to reclaim our roads. The county expects to receive as many as a dozen bids to reclaim the roads in MWF and it should be very competitive. After the bids are received, probably in February, the Marion County Board of Commissioners will review them and call for a final public hearing. We expect that hearing to occur in late March or early April. I'll be sure to keep you posted. If you have questions, please submit them to mwfroads@gmail.com. 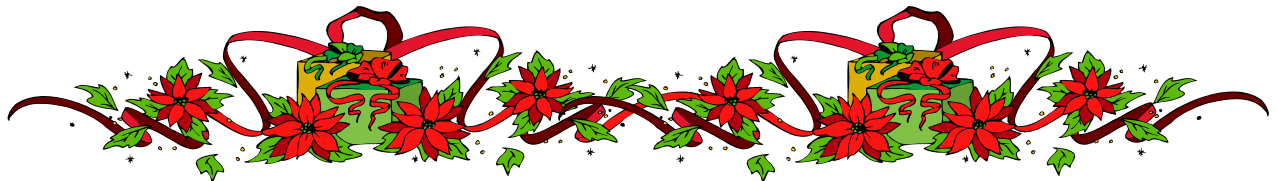

Drainage Work to Begin Soon

The MWFPOA was recently informed that Marion County Stormwater Management has completed the plans and drawings for addressing the various drainage problems brought to their attention a few months ago. Stormwater Management has met with Road Operations staff to review the scope and plans, and they intend to proceed as follows:

- A letter will go out to all the residents who will need to clean out their own driveway culverts as part of the project. Remember, the culverts under the roads are the responsibility of the County, but the culverts (if any) under your driveway must be maintained by the property owner.
- Affected homeowners will be personally contacted about a week before work commences.
- Drainage crews will expose pipe ends to aid residents with the cleanout of their driveway culverts
- After cleanout, the Drainage crews will come back to finish up the work grading swales, etc.

Please be on the lookout for this letter and act promptly to allow the project to move forward in a timely manner. The drainage work needs to be completed before the road reclamation project begins.

BONUS RECIPES FOR A HOLIDAY BRUNCH

Are you having guests over the holidays? Here is a brunch menu that can mostly be made ahead of time. It's easy and delicious.



HOLIDAY BRUNCH MENU

- Brunch Casserole**
- Pumpkin Bread**
- Fruit Salad**
- Orange Juice or Mimosas**
- Coffee, Tea, Milk**

Brunch Casserole: Use Cheddar or a mixture of hard cheeses. I also add a healthy dash of nutmeg, which makes it seem more festive for the holidays. Serves 6 as is, but since it can be made ahead of time, I have made 3 batches with sausage in one, shrimp in the second and ham in the third for 21 people.

Ingredients:

6 Slices of White Bread (Pepperidge Farm or firm style bread is best to use).

1 lb of cooked shrimp, cooked sausage patties crumbled, or small chunks of ham

1/2 lb of Cheddar or mixed Cheeses in small square or rectangle slices

1/2 tsp dry mustard

3 whole beaten eggs

Salt to Taste

1 pt milk

1/4 cup melted butter

Break bread and cheese into bite sized pieces. Arrange bread & cheese into several layers in a greased (buttered) casserole dish. Beat eggs, add mustard & salt and melted butter. Add milk. Mix together and pour over layered casserole. Cover casserole.

Let stand a minimum of 3 hours refrigerated.....preferably overnight. You want the liquids to thoroughly soak the bread.

Bake 1 hour in a 350 degree oven covered. Remove cover during the last 10 minutes to brown top if you want.

Pumpkin Bread (Spread finished slices with cream cheese as an option.)

5-1/4 Cups Flour

1 tbs. Baking Soda

2 tsp Salt

1 tbs cinnamon

2 tsp nutmeg

4-12 Cups Sugar

1-1/2 Cup Veg Oil (Safflower or ?)

6 Eggs

4 Cups Canned Pumpkin

Preheat Oven 350

Mix Dry Ingredients (Sifted)

Make hole in the middle of dry ingredients and add liquids

Spray mold

Fill Half Full

Bake for 1 hour.

Depending on the size of the mold, you might get two.

This freezes very well and is very moist. Serve slightly warm. YUM!

Fruit Salad: Cut up melons and grapes or other firm fruit early and refrigerate. Add sliced strawberries and kiwis for holiday color and bananas raspberries or blackberries at the last minute. I always had a touch of vinegrete type dressing to make the fruit more like salad than dessert .
