PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: Flags, Trees, Recognition, and "Look At That Place!"



We missed you. Yes we did. It's too bad you couldn't make it. We missed your smiling faces and your input. You missed getting together with your neighbors, meeting

some new residents, helping the Association make decisions, and some great treats. Whoever brought that chocolate cake, "Thank you very much!" In fact, I just remembered I brought a piece home, so I'll be right back...(musical interlude with the tune of your choice)... Boy, that was good.

OK, back to business. Of course I'm talking about our Association meeting on September 18th. We certainly understand that not everyone can attend our meetings. We are fortunate to have a solid core of members who do try to attend every meeting, and thankfully are not bashful about telling us how we did. So for those who were not able to make it, this time, I'll cover some highlights from the meeting for you. Remember, you can also read the minutes from both the Board and Association meetings on our website.

One of the items approved by the mem-

bership was the purchase and installation of a 20 foot telescoping flagpole for Friendship Park. It is to be installed in time for the Veterans Appreciation BBQ which is on November 7th. Tickets for the BBQ will be available at the next Board meeting and by contacting me. They are free for the Veteran and \$5 for everyone else. This is a 100% made in America flagpole and has a 15 year warranty. For those of you concerned that some urchin will try to steal it, it can be removed and placed in the storage shed when we don't have an activity going on. For those of you have seen the flagpole in our yard, it is the same one we will get for the park. U.S. Veterans Network distributes the flagpole and a portion of the sale of every flagpole goes to the American Legion.

We have several large dead, dying or down trees in the park that will be difficult for anyone but a professional tree service to handle. They are leaning toward the power lines, playground equipment or fence and roadway. Also, the remains of the trees need to be dealt with and the stumps ground down. We can't have a several day burn-fest in the park, no water is available and who will babysit it? Leaving the rounds for people to haul away does not work since there are currently portions of trees cut

down a few years ago still there that on park clean-up days we are slowly burning. Another factor to consider is everyone's safety. If a tree were to come down wrong, someone were to have a heart attack or get hurt cutting one of these trees down it would have been well worth the cost to have them professionally removed. While we have a couple of estimates, after the Associations approval at the meeting, we will get some more and move forward with getting it done.

As you might remember if you read this column a couple of months ago, we started asking members at the Association meetings to recognize our residents who have done something good in Meadow Wood Farms. This past meeting was no different and it didn't take long for names to be put forth.

Jessica St. Hilaire was recognized for taking over the Newsletter for a few months while Jodie was out of town. Jessica did an outstanding job and started a series of articles profiling talents and hobbies your neighbors have or enjoy. Hopefully this will be an ongoing feature of the Newsletter. Maybe Jessica could be a roving reporter to ferret out fun facts from all of us. Our many thanks and a hats off to Jessica for keeping the presses running for us.

MWF Roads Status Report – Jim Bain bain2@cfl.rr.com 352-237-9672

Work has started! I'll keep this brief and try to address a couple of questions that have been raised in the first couple of weeks of the project. We conducted the Partnering Session with representatives from MWF, the Contractor, the County, the Engineer, and the Site Superintendents in early September. As we had hoped, it went very well and established a dialogue between all of the stakeholders that should prove to be invaluable as the project progresses.

The process of reclaiming the roads utilizes a reclaiming machine that looks like a modified road grader. It chews up the very thin existing layer of asphalt and mixes it in with the underlying lime rock. More lime rock is added, the resulting surfaced is rolled and compacted and sealed with liquid asphalt. Several days later, the paving machine will apply the top layer of new asphalt. I have talked with both the county and the contractor and am quite comfortable with both the process and the expected result.

The paving crews are starting on the east half of the neighborhood on Neverbend and will complete this half before moving to the west half. Needless to say, this could change as conditions warrant.

The scheduled completion is March 30, 2015. This, too, could change depending primarily on how much rain we get over the winter.

There are a number of machines and people involved in each operation. It is critical that we all use caution when passing the crews as they are focused on their work and may not even be aware that we are there. Please, be patient and safe when encountering the crews.

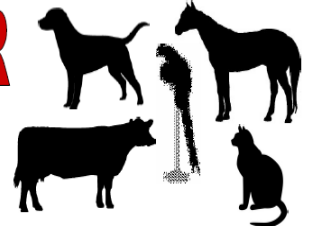

ASPHALT PAVING NOTICE

Weather permitting, resurfacing activities in this neighborhood are scheduled to begin within the next several days (possibly tomorrow).

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us complete this project with as little inconvenience as possible to all involved.

1. Please park your vehicles at least three feet off the paved road surface.
2. Do not run sprinklers the night before that might leave the paved surface in a wet condition.
3. Keep young children and pets indoors and away from the hot asphalt during paving operations.
4. Do not drive on "tack" coat of black, liquid asphalt applied just before resurfacing. Driving on "fresh tack" and then onto your driveway will stain your driveway.

After resurfacing is applied, wait at least 30 minutes before driving on the new surface, and avoid turning wheels when the vehicle is stationary.
