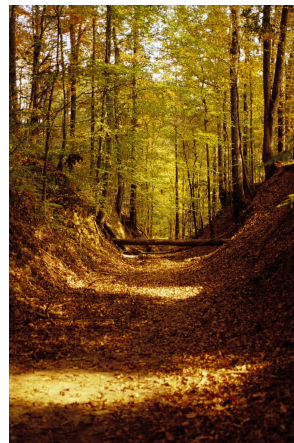
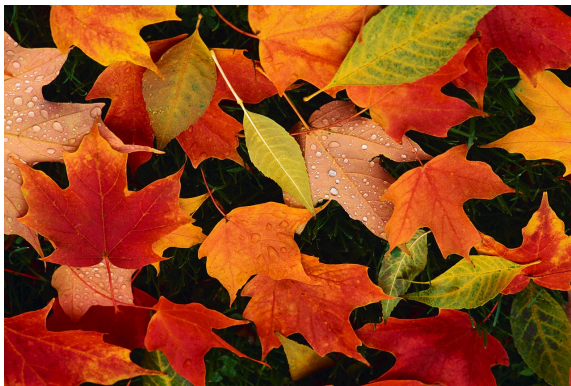

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: Will you help a seed grow?

Abruptly it arrives next to you. It sniffs your arm and suddenly – YEOW! Darn cold nose. When you jerk away you hear it. WOOF! The 2:00 in the morning monster is at your bedside again. Not one to be ignored, she now has decided it's either time to

go out or just time to wake you up to say; "Hi! How you doing? Want to pet me? Did you like the extra water I brought in my jowls and put on your side of the bed? Wanta play?"

MWF Roads Status Report – Jim Bain bain2@cfl.rr.com 352-237-9672

Good news! The road crews are ahead of schedule – in spite of all the rain we got in September. As of today (10/20/14), they have reclaimed nearly 6 miles of roadway, tearing up the asphalt and 5 inches of the underlying lime rock. They then return the resulting mixture to the roadway, roll it to make it smooth and compact, and apply a coat of liquid asphalt and sand to seal it. So far, they have done Never Bend, Middleground, Lakewood Circle, Meadow Wood Drive, Challedon, Carry Back, and Lookout.

Today, they began the paving process, overlaying a 1 ¼ inch layer of asphalt over the previously prepared surface. In one day, they completed half of the road over the entire length of both Never Bend and Middleground. By the time you read this, they will be even further along. As I mentioned last month, they have until March 31, 2015 to substantially complete the project. If the weather cooperates, they hope to be done sooner.

Please remember some simple rules:

Please wait at least 30 minutes before driving on the new pavement and avoid turning your wheels sharply or when your car is stationary as it will damage the new surface.

Do NOT drive on the tack coat of liquid asphalt applied before sanding the road and before the asphalt is applied. It will stick to your car and stain your driveway.

Finally, I want to thank those folks who have volunteered to deliver treats to the workers on alternating Fridays. It has gone a long way to helping show the crews our hospitality. I assure you that it makes them feel good about the work they are doing for us. 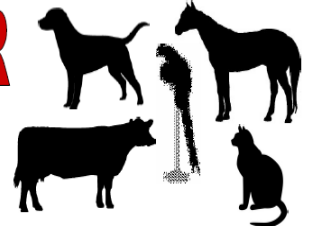
