Wow! As I write this, our road project is moving along very quickly. To date, the crews have reclaimed over 15 miles of the 17.5 miles of road in MWF. They have paved over half of the neighborhood. They are over 3 months ahead of schedule and hope to be substantially complete by the end of December.


