So to you men and women who live here and work for the Florida Highway Patrol, Marion County SO, Ocala PD and other local, state and federal agencies, we thank you for your service. Deb and I have proudly placed "Blue Lives Matter" stickers on our vehicles. Meadow Wood Farms supports you.

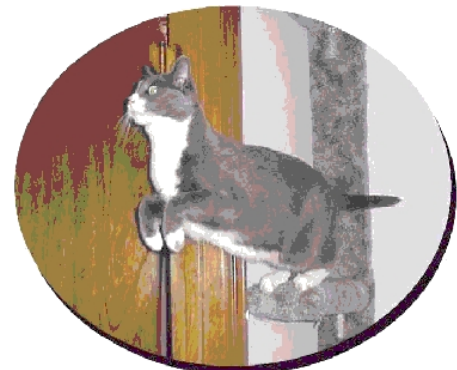

Dealing with MWF wildlife

Coyotes: There was a recent incident on Wintergreen Way where a cat was attacked and killed by two coyotes inside a fenced yard. The four foot no-climb fence was apparently an ineffective barrier and the coyotes were able to jump over it. Any pet owner can imagine the grief they would feel to find their beloved four legged family member attacked and partially devoured.

It had been posted on meadowwoodfarm1 that someone has been deliberately feeding coyotes. Besides being unlawful, that is extremely dangerous - both for the coyote and for the people involved. Coyotes are naturally leery of human contact but quickly lose that healthy fear once they associate humans with food. They cannot be lawfully trapped and relocated. Once they become too aggressive they will likely be destroyed. There is a saying about wild animals: "A fed animal is a dead animal". That is especially true when it pertains to coyotes.

If you own pets keep in mind that coyotes are active both day and night. If your pets are allowed outside they should be watched carefully and kept in a fenced area. While rare, attacks on humans, especially small children, have occurred.

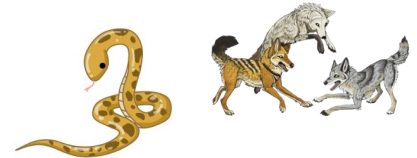
Snakes: A common discussion on the community forum involves the local snake population. There seems to be a strong consensus that snakes should be eradicated. While a snake inside the house is certainly an issue those outside the house provide many benefits. Snakes help control the population of many more dangerous pests. They prey on insects and rodents. Rodents carry ticks, fleas, and are carriers of many nasty diseases. They also attract animals which feed on them - including coyotes.

As for the danger of being bitten by a poisonous snake: the typical victim is a young male - who is bitten on the hand or arm. Usually because the "victim" was doing something he should not be doing. We are way too large for a snake to see us as a food source. They want nothing to do with us and typically retreat when we approach. Most encounters can be avoided.

Use common sense when working in an area likely to conceal snakes. Piles of wood, under rocks, and gopher/tortoise holes are favorite snake hideouts. Keep your hands and feet out of such places.

The most common poisonous snake in this area is the Pygmy Rattlesnake. There are likely hundreds of them living within Meadow Wood Farms and millions within the state of Florida. Just how dangerous are they to humans? There has never been a reported death in Florida related to a bite from a Pygmy Rattlesnake.

“MWF MEMORY WALKERS” ROCK THE WALK TO END ALZHEIMER’S

On a (thankfully) overcast Saturday morning, ten people representing MWF, in purple baseball caps, walked 2.4 miles with almost 900 other folks to raise funds and awareness for Alzheimer’s. One of us actually has Alzheimer’s; several of us have lost family members to Alzheimer’s; all of us feel a responsibility to spread the word about the importance of research into strategies for prevention, diagnosis, treatment and even cure for this dreadful disease. One out of three seniors will experience dementia of some kind before the end of their life; we need to act now!

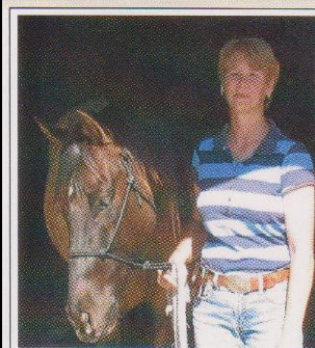
