What team work. It was a sight to see. I never would have believed it would have been so easy! What an accomplishment for all involved. It looked like they knew what they were doing. You should have been there! But then again, maybe you were.

Am I talking about some sporting event? Maybe football, baseball, basketball, soccer or some other team sport where folks work together day in and day out to accomplish a single goal and are highly paid? Could it be some activity where they become such a finely honed group of professionals they are recognized the world over for their accomplishments?

Nope. Not even close. What I am talking about are about 20 plus of your neighbors who helped re-build the park fence recently. They showed up ahead of time, worked hard, had some laughs and finished in record time. Let me tell you about it in case you were not there. It was like an old fashioned barn raising. Meadow Wood Farms needed help and our neighbors showed up.

The work was scheduled to begin at 9 in the morning on February 13th. I showed up to open the gate around 8:30 and there were already folks there. Before 9 we had 3 tractors and about 20ish folks ready to start. The directions they got were simple and reminiscent of when the railroad was built across the west. They were to start at each end and make it meet in the middle. They were basically told; "Split into two teams. Each team should start at one end of the old fence. Take out the old fence and build the new fence. Here are the materials for the new fence. If you run into issues, use your best judgment."

Off they went. Within a few minutes most of the old fence boards were down. With tractors scurrying around like ants, the posts were pulled, and posts and boards were hauled and burned. People saw what needed to be done and did it. No complaints, no chest beating or pawing of the ground, no whining either. EVERYONE who was there pitched in and accomplished this task. They were done by 1:30 and that included a pizza lunch break. And then like the Lone Ranger, they rode off into the afternoon on their trusty steeds. I stood there with a couple of others scratching my head and looking in amazement at what we had accomplished.

There are several parts of this I find awesome. First, this was an all volunteer group of men and women who for the most part had never worked together. This was far beyond the "regular" few who show up for park work projects. Oh, there were the few there who have helped with cleaning up at the park and such, but to have everyone there work on something like this as team and play well with others, that was special.

Secondly, these were neighbors, who in many cases, had never met before that day. There were folks who have been in the hood for years and some who have only been here for weeks and months. It certainly shows that the folks in Meadow Wood Farms care about their community. I was honored to be part of it and to have had the opportunity to help get this project off the ground as a member of our Board.

As a member of the Board for 3 years, I have had the opportunity to interact with many great folks in Meadow Wood Farms. Whoever the next President will be will have a lot of help from all of those folks, as well as those that have served before them. They have made a great team to work with who are all very dedicated to MWF. So far I know that from the current Board, Bob will run again as Vice President, Leslie as Secretary and Dick as Treasurer. That doesn't mean someone else can not come forward and be on the ballot for one of those positions.

The only position I haven't heard about anyone seeking is President. I feel it's time for some new blood and fresh ideas. Heck, we moved here in September of 2012 and by June of 2013, I was serving as Vice President and then President. Both past Presidents Bain and Waller had likewise only been here for a short period of time before becoming actively involved in the Association and Board. Many other folks involved with the Board and Committees have jumped right in shortly after moving into MWF. It just shows you don't have to be a long term resident to get involved. You just have to care about Meadow Wood Farms.

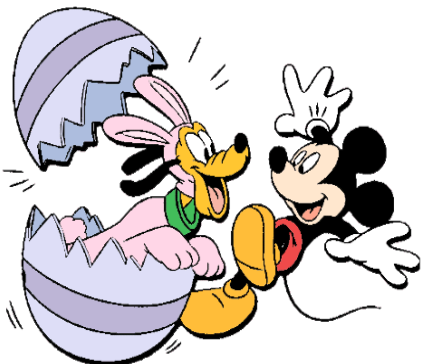

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR MARION COUNTY VOTERS

As mentioned in the February newsletter, the date for the next county election is **TUESDAY, MARCH 15th**. In addition to being a Presidential Preference Primary, the ballot also includes a County Special Referendum proposing a 1% Sales Tax which will be used to fund Road Projects and Public Safety capital needs. The sales tax would be levied for four years, from 2017 through 2020.

Although Florida is a closed primary state, **ALL REGISTERED VOTERS** are eligible to vote on the sales tax referendum. Therefore, even if you are not registered as a Republican or a Democrat, you will still be given a ballot with the referendum as the only item.

If you wish to vote by mail in this election, you may request a Vote-By-Mail ballot online at www.VoteMarion.com or by phone at 352-620-3290. There will also be nine Early Voting Sites throughout the county for those wishing to avoid crowds on Election Day. Early Voting will be available at those nine sites from March 5-12. Site locations can be obtained by consulting www.VoteMarion.com

If you are opting to vote in person, please note that Florida Statute 101.043 requires all voters to produce **current and valid photo and signature identification**. Acceptable IDs include:

- Florida Driver's License or ID Card issued by the DMV
- Military ID
- Debit or Credit Card with signature
- Neighborhood Association ID with photo and/or signature
- United States Passport
- Student ID, Public Assistance ID, Retirement Center ID

Following the March 15th election, Florida will also hold a regular Primary on August 30th and the General Election on November 8th. If you missed the deadline for updating or changing your voter registration information, you will be able to do so until August 1st for the Primary, and October 11th for the General Election.

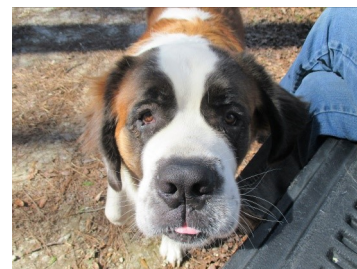

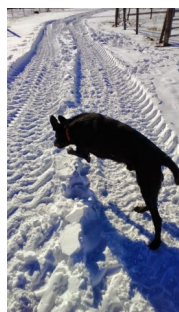

An Open Letter to the Residents of MWF who own pets...

So an offer to “help Sandy” has turned into an almost full time “Occupation”. However, it takes a village—and this one has responded. My heartfelt thanks to the folks in our neighborhood who have cared enough to pay attention to animals out there “on their own” and taken appropriate action. Most calls are concerning dogs and I have hosted several at my home temporarily. Some “repeat offenders” are well known and simply to respective owners. The more worrisome are those with no means of identification - when there is no response to email posts on the MWF site, I have reluctantly turned them over to Animal Control. I do follow up by phone— two dogs are presently for adoption (Traveler and #159489).

Moving forward in 2016—a resident on Lake View Drive has offered to donate a dog kennel for use on my property, which will be greatly appreciated. (It isn't here yet, so don't even think about it). This will allow me to confine a dog temporarily in safe surroundings without exposing it to my own animals. There has also been an offer of donations and I will be happy to accept the following types of items:

1. clean throw rugs, towels, or blankets as crate/doghouse liners (old ones that you would otherwise discard)
2. Sturdy food/water bowls
3. Collars/leashes (lead ropes also work well with larger dogs)
4. Dog Kibble



I am not intending to set up an actual “rescue” because I cannot take on the Financial responsibility for healthcare that these animals often need. However, sending a dog away with that Animal Control Truck reduces me to tears— Yes, I would like to save them all! The “good” news is that Marion County Animal Services does not immediately euthanize an animal they pick up unless it is a case of clear aggression, severe illness or injury. It is checked for a microchip, held as a “stray” for 3 days, and then neutered, given immunizations, and “cleaned up”. It is then made available for adoption— the photos are posted on their website, Petfinder, and possibly other rescue sites.

I would like to request that any of you have not completed the registry form for your pet (s), do so in the New Year. That information may assure that you quickly get your pet back if he/she “escapes” at some point— we all say that won't happen— but unpredictable circumstances do arise.

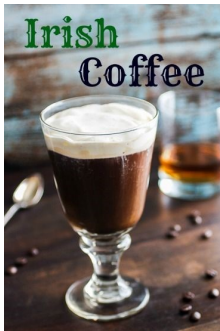

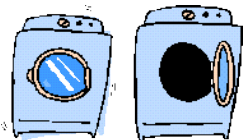


