#### **Control Committee** Community Matters

Greetings from your friendly neighborhood Control Committee!

We are pleased that members of the community are being so diligent with caring for their properties. Many of us chose to include mowing and weed eating the county owned areas in front of our homes to help keep the neighborhood looking its best. A huge thanks goes to those who also mow the road sides of the adjoining undeveloped properties! When walking without having sidewalks, it is much more pleasant to be able to step off the road when cars approach on to nice short grass instead of knee high weeds.

The Control Committee has received a few phone calls regarding interpretation of the Deed Restrictions and Bylaws. This is a promising indication that people are interested in complying with the rules that govern our community. Our neighborhood newsletter, along with our website, provides the Committee members contact information.

There have also been some calls regarding signs posted around the neighborhood. Real estate signs are only permitted on the property that is for sale or rent. Real estate directional signs to the property are not permitted. The Control Committee has made several calls to rectify improper signage around the neighborhood. The Control Committee makes every attempt to contact the owners of the signs by calling the numbers on the signs. We request that they remove their signs within a reasonable time frame. If the signs are outdated or no longer wanted, the Control Committee will remove them. Thanks goes to our concerned citizens who have assisted in removing some of them.

Hello, I would like to introduce myself, Caitlin Bainum. I am a recent University of Florida Equine Science graduate, and the new Marion County Farm Management Extension Agent.

My role is to make it all about you and how I may be able to assist in many of the aspects of farm management such as productive manure management, grazing strategies, stocking rates, and pasture management

As equine owners in "Horse Capital of the World", it is up to us to utilize Best Management Practices for reducing our ecological footprint. The upfront need for Marion County is preservation of our springs. We are home to some of the largest spring fed water sources in the country and they are in extreme jeopardy due to intense Nitrogen loading, owed in part to agricultural practices.

Many of you may have known my predecessor, Jamie Cohen; I am looking forward to continuing her progress in all areas to preserve the quality and longevity of our resources so vital to our quality of life here in Marion County.

My ultimate goal is to be the best means of information possible for you. There are some unique funding opportunities coming available for the equine community in Marion County to improve farm management in alignment with Best Management Practices and I would love to see if these programs could benefit your operation

Considering I am new to the area I could benefit from learning from you and what challenges you may face. Can we schedule a chat soon and get to know each other? As a horse owner myself, I would enjoy visiting your farm and having a hands on experience.



Suzanne has had a very busy and rewarding life, living to the fullest. Born and raised in Ontario, Canada, she graduated from high school and a year later got her college degree in Economics and Child Psychology. Interior Design was not her choice at that time. She found that Economics was okay as she liked Math, but Child Psychology was not to her liking. She loved traveling, so she decided to take some time and see the sights. 



Lauderdale that she worked her magic was Orlando and Ormond Beach. She then settled in Ocala, and got her Green Building Inspectors license too.
